A MESSAGE FROM OUR TEAM

It's a Wrap!

As the 2017/2018 fiscal year concludes, we are pleased to report back on our work in the last year to advance quality early learning and support child care professionals in Northwest Washington.

Just a few highlights over the last 12 months include:

- Coaching & Customer Service: In the last year, 13 new staff members joined our dedicated team now staffed with 33 people. Together we serve more than 800 licensed child care providers, Head Start, and ECEAP programs in Whatcom, Skagit, Snohomish, Island, and San Juan Counties. Our coaches work together with more than 462 programs that participate in Early Achievers to support quality early learning opportunities in child care settings.
- Professional Development: 20 state-approved trainers led 365 hours of STARS training for 1,251 child care professionals.
- Supporting Businesses: 17 aspiring entrepreneurs participated in Q & A sessions on how to start a child care business. Special thanks to Pauli Owen from Pauli's Playschool, Madelyn Flannegan from the State of Washington, and Marie Keller from the Imagine Institute for joining together with Early Achiever Coaches to explain the licensing requirements and steps to starting a high quality child care business. We appreciate your support for new businesses!
- Teaching Strategies GOLD Pilot: Nineteen child care providers in our region were selected from a competitive pool of applicants to participate in the State's first Teaching Strategies GOLD pilot that is specifically for licensed family child care and child care centers that are not participating in Head Start or ECEAP. Participants include 12 child care centers and 7 family child care providers who will integrate this ongoing, observation-based assessment system into their programs to help teachers and families focus on what matters most for children's success. Kudos to all programs that applied and demonstrated their commitment to promoting quality early learning.
